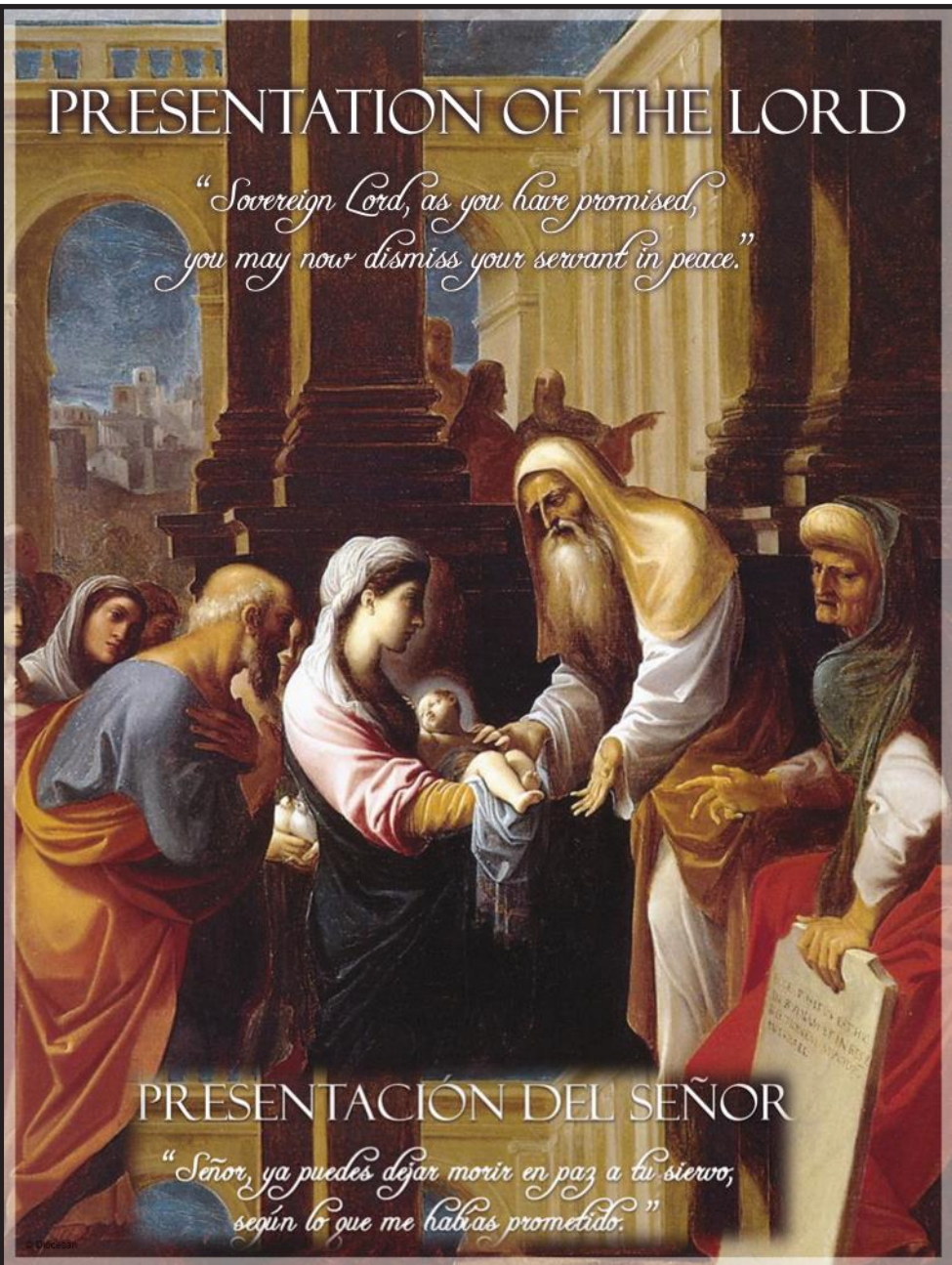

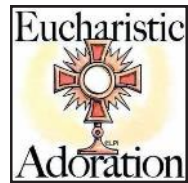



The Presentation of the Lord

The interaction of Simeon and the Holy Family at the Christ Child’s Presentation in the Temple is an early moment of revelation in the Gospel. This exchange is briefly and mysteriously documented in the Gospel of Luke, Chapter 2, and does not appear in the other three Gospels. Its inclusion in the recitation of the Rosary in the Joyful Mysteries indicates its profound importance, which invites deeper meditation on the rites of Presentation and the prophetic words of Simeon.

In fulfilling a rite required by the Law of Moses, Saint Joseph and the Blessed Virgin Mary journey to Jerusalem forty days after the birth of Christ, establishing its celebration on February 2nd. The newborn Son is presented to God in the Temple of Jerusalem as the Law of Moses required, and it was customary to provide either a lamb and a turtledove, or two turtledoves as sacrificial offering. Simeon, a devout elder, approaches the young family because he recognizes Christ as the Messiah, sharing that “[t]his Child is destined to be the downfall and rise of many in Israel, a sign that will be opposed.” He further reveals to Mary that “your own soul a sword shall pierce” as a result of His born duty. In response to this upsetting and confusing proclamation, Mary and Joseph simply “marvel at what was said about Him” (Luke 2:33-35). In hearing the coming foreboding and trial of their lives, the holy parents are admirable in their total docility to God’s will.

In depicting this scripture passage, all three figures are simply dressed, as none of them are wealthy. Not much description is offered of Simeon other than that he was a devout man who spoke with God, as it seems almost face to face, well enough in fact, to recognize His Son when he saw Him. Not much is delineated in the background where a single lamp hangs. In contemporary Mass rites, a Sanctuary Lamp is lit and hangs from the ceiling of the Church when the Blessed Sacrament is present in the Tabernacle, just as the Body and Blood of Christ was present in the Temple, prefiguring the purpose of the Child born to die for the redemption of sin and restore the hope of salvation.

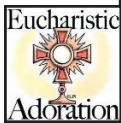
Finally, this scene depicts a symbolic gesture that is shown in the presence of Christ Himself. In the hierarchy of gifts brought by the faithful to the presentation of a child to God, turtle doves are second best. The highest gift, normally affordable only to the wealthy, would have been a newborn lamb. In Joseph and Mary’s case, they have provided the turtle doves, and God has provided the Lamb.
