The Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we heard last Sunday, St. John was writing about the promise of the Blessed Eucharist at a time when Christians accepted the Mass and Holy Communion as the essential act of Christian worship. Very probably he omitted many details when describing this promise. The "disciples" who murmured evidently saw nothing but a man in Christ, It was very natural, therefore, that they could not accept his saying that they should eat his body and drink his blood. Thus it seems most probable that when Christ says they lacked "faith," he had given them sufficient proofs that he was more than a man. These individuals among the disciples, however, refused to open their minds to these proofs; therein was their guilt. Their minds were earth-bound and were determined to remain earth-bound. Faith is a gift of the Father, as Christ says to those disciples: "no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father," but the Father has offered them this gift and they have refused to accept it; otherwise they would not be guilty.

No one who accepts Christ for what he is, the Son of God in human form, has any difficulty in believing that he left us himself in the Eucharist as a sacrifice and a sacrament. This does not mean that we understand this gift of Christ in all its details—it was an act of divine power and as such beyond full human comprehension. In Galilee he promised to give his body and blood in the Eucharist—to be our spiritual nourishment — communion — and our means of offering an absolutely pleasing sacrifice to God every time his body and blood are made present by the words of his ordained minister. He fulfilled that promise at the Last Supper. He gave to his Apostles and their successors the power to repeat this act of divine love when he said: "Do this in memory of me."

Many of us may need to examine ourselves as regards the full and effective use we make of that gift. Every time we attend at Mass do we realize that Christ is offering himself to his Father for our sanctification and the sanctification of the world? Do we realize that we, through his minister at the altar, are offering infinite thanksgiving, infinite atonement, infinite adoration, infinitely effective petition, to our Father in heaven through the sacrifice of his divine Son in the Mass? Are we always worthy to act this part, are our consciences fit to allow us to partake of this sacrifice in Holy Communion? A true Christian who realizes and appreciates what the Son of God has done and is still doing for him will try always to make himself less unworthy, for not even the greatest saint was worthy to partake of this act of divine love.

DECIDIDOS Y NO AMBIGUOS

En la primera lectura, Josué pide a los pueblos que ha conquistado no ser ambiguos, sino que decidan que hacer con su vida, basándose en las obras que Dios hizo en el pasado reciente al pueblo de Israel.

Josué si decidió y dijo: *"En cuanto a mi toca, mi familia y yo serviremos al Señor"*.

Debemos concientizar y llenar nuestra historia de experiencias de Dios propias, para no caer en ambigüedades en la vida de amor y misericordia que nos propone Cristo para llegar al Padre.

El salmo, nos dice que, concientizando por nuestra oración, las experiencias recientes de Dios, no caeremos en ambigüedades y dudas en nuestra relación con Él ni sobre la calidad de vida que se nos ofrece al vivir de esta manera: *"Bendeciré al Señor a todas horas, no cesará mi boca de alabarlo. Por tal motivo "Haz la prueba y verás qué bueno es el Señor"*.

En el Evangelio, Jesús nos pide que seamos decididos en el seguimiento a Él. A los discípulos ambiguos les escandaliza la forma de hablar de Jesús más que el contenido de sus palabras: *"Este modo de hablar es intolerable, ¿quién puede admitir eso?"*. Y por eso Jesús le responde: *"Las palabras que les he dicho son espíritu y vida, y a pesar de esto, algunos de ustedes no creen"*. Las palabras que les había dicho Jesús son: *"Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida"*. Este es el mensaje difícil de hacer realidad en nuestras vidas, pero es el "Sacramento de nuestra Fe", tal como decimos en la celebración Eucarística después de la consagración del Pan y el Vino.

Jesús les pregunta: *"¿También ustedes quieren dejarme?"*. La pregunta que debemos hacernos a nosotros es: ¿Estamos decididos a Formar a Jesús en nuestros corazones, a ser seguidores fieles a su Palabra, y continuadores de su obra, con hechos concretos en nuestra vida? ¿creemos o no creemos en Jesús?

El cristiano es DECIDIDO Y NO AMBIGUO: nuestra respuesta debe ser decidida como la de Pedro: *"Señor, ¿a quién iremos? Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna; y nosotros creemos y sabemos que tú eres el Santo de Dios"*.

This weekend—Special Collection for the Church in Haiti

The August 14th earthquake brought devastation to Haiti's southwest peninsula and has affected people in three dioceses. And, of course, Tropical Storm Grace's passage on August 16 has aggravated an already desperate situation. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) has its main base in the city of Les Cayes, which suffered major damage, and is already offering humanitarian assistance. Our Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Miami is also collecting funds to assist the great human needs following this latest natural disaster. The US government through USAID and US Coast Guard along with other countries are on the ground offering assistance. Search and Rescue Teams from various parts of the US have responded to help. However, in a few weeks, when this initial emergency is overcome and these aid workers go home, it is the Church that remains with the people. As Bishop Joseph Gontrand Decoste of Jeremie told me, scores of parish churches, chapels, schools, and clinics have been razed. Rectories have been turned into rubble, like the residence of Les Cayes' Cardinal Chibly Langlois which collapsed injuring him and killing a priest and two employees.

When everybody goes home, the Church will remain with her people. The people are counting on the Church. **Help the Haitian Church serve her people.**

Este fin de semana - Colecta especial para la Iglesia en Haití

El terremoto del 14 de agosto trajo devastación al suroeste de la península de Haití y ha afectado a personas en tres diócesis. Y, por supuesto, el paso de la tormenta tropical Grace el 16 de agosto ha agravado una situación ya desesperada.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) tiene su sede en la ciudad de Les Cayes, a pesar de quedar gravemente dañada, ahora está ofreciendo asistencia humanitaria. Nuestra CARITAS de la Arquidiócesis de Miami también está recaudando fondos para ayudar a las grandes necesidades humanas, después de este último desastre natural. El gobierno de los Estados Unidos a través de USAID y la Guardia Costera de los Estados Unidos, con otros países están en Haití ofreciendo asistencia. Equipos de búsqueda y rescate de varias partes de EE. UU. respondieron positivamente para ayudar. Sin embargo, en unas semanas, cuando se supere esta emergencia inicial y estos trabajadores humanitarios se vayan a casa, será la Iglesia la que permanecerá con el pueblo. Como dijo el obispo Joseph Gontrand Decoste de Jeremie, en docenas de parroquias han quedado arrasadas las iglesias, capillas, escuelas y clínicas. Las rectorías se han convertido en escombros, como la residencia del cardenal de Cayes, Chibly Langlois, que se derrumbó hiriéndolo y matando a un sacerdote y dos empleados.

Cuando todos se vayan a casa, la Iglesia permanecerá con su pueblo. La gente cuenta con la Iglesia universal. Ayudemos a la Iglesia de Haití que sirve a su pueblo.
