## 5º DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

February 7, 2021  
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Surely the people of Capernaum saw enough that first day of Christ's public ministry among them to make them realize that this man from Nazareth who had come amongst them was no ordinary preacher, no ordinary rabbi, no ordinary man. They saw that he preached as one having authority; they saw that by a simple command he cast out demons and removed all bodily ailments. Yet though they were astonished and amazed at his power, their worldly outlook did not let them rise above their own small interests. Our Lord did not blame them or criticize them, he knew and fully understood their slowness of mind in regard to things spiritual, and he knew also that they would eventually give themselves wholeheartedly to his kingdom.

When the four Apostles found him praying in a lonely place, they told him that all Capernaum was searching for him, but he knew why they were searching for him. They wanted to see more miracles and very likely they were hoping that he would stay on in Capernaum and the sick and the maimed from the whole of Galilee would be brought there for healing. This would increase their earthly business and prosperity. His answer to the Apostles, while not directly condemning this worldly outlook, shows that his mission had an entirely different objective. He had come on earth not to bring earthly prosperity to any town or country but to bring spiritual salvation and blessing on all people. That very morning he began to carry out his mission and for the remaining two years or more he went from town to town preaching the kingdom of God.

By his death he conquered death for us; by his resurrection he opened the gates of heaven for us and led the way there for all who will follow him. This is the good news Christ brought to our world. This is the meaning of Christianity; this is why we are Christians. We are members of Christ's kingdom on earth, so that when our life here ends we shall be members of his everlasting heavenly kingdom. Do I, by my words and deeds, prove to those with whom I live and work that I am convinced there is a future life after death, that reaching that life is the most important thing in this world for me, and that it is through living my short earthly life as a true Christian that I can earn that eternal life? If I can say yes to these questions I am, thank God, on the right road. But if my answer is "no" then it is time I had another good look to see where I went off the road, and to find out that I can return to that right road once more.

Domingo V del tiempo ordinario

ORAMOS LO VIVIDO PARA LUEGO VIVIR  
LO ORADO

La conclusión de la primera lectura de hoy, tomada del libro de Job es que la vida no tiene premios ni castigos enviados por Dios. Nuestro Dios no es el dios de "las pruebas", ni nosotros podemos comprenderlo todo: los momentos difíciles no son castigos, ni la vida cómoda premios de Dios. En ambas situaciones, la vida tiene sentido si incluimos a Dios en ella.

En la segunda lectura, san Pablo nos dice que la manera de incluir a Dios en nuestra vida, como Job lo hizo, es incluir a Jesús, que es la vida en el amor y servicio a los demás empezando en nuestra propia familia, para expandirse a todos los ambientes; esto implica anunciar el Evangelio: *"Todo lo hago por el Evangelio, para participar yo también de sus bienes"*

En el Evangelio, Jesús cura a la suegra de Pedro, para que ella pueda servir y así efectivamente ella lo hace. De allí se concluye que cuando superamos una enfermedad, o una difícil situación, debemos descubrir la exigencia del mensaje del Evangelio de hoy: por nuestra sanación, tenemos que servir y amar.

La sanación y la liberación por el poder de Dios es para que sirvamos a los demás. Así debemos actuar en nuestra vida de servicio, sabiendo que no podemos servir a todos, pero si a todos los que podamos.

Jesús tenía un horario para la oración y nosotros los cristianos, también debemos tenerlo. *"De madrugada, cuando todavía estaba muy oscuro, Jesús se levantó, salió y se fue a un lugar solitario, donde se puso a orar"*; debemos empezar nuestro día de servicio, con la oración, pero una oración conectada con nuestra realidad.

La oración, no puede ser un paréntesis en la vida, sino articulada con ella y particularmente con nuestra vida cristiana al servicio de los demás, tal como hace Jesús, que al terminar se va a predicar a pueblos cercanos, entendiendo que la predicación es de palabras y obras. Así la vida es más auténtica, más consciente y abierta a Dios. ORAMOS LO VIVIDO PARA LUEGO VIVIR LO ORADO.

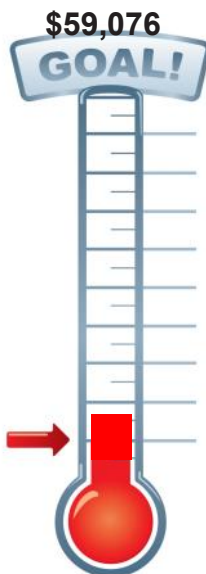

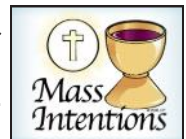

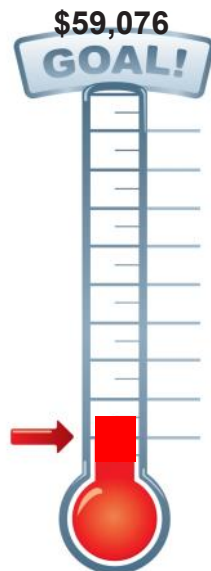
