16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The **Gospel** is from St. Matthew 13:24-43. In the parable, the weed does not destroy the wheat. It only makes it more difficult for the wheat to grow to maturity. So it is with the Christian. No one can take his faith from him, but living up to it is made more difficult by the evil influence and bad example of sinners. If some succumb to this evil influence and give up the practice of their faith, the fault is theirs. God can force no man to serve him.

The patience of the farmer in letting the weed grow on until harvest time, exemplifies the infinite mercy of God toward sinners. The weed could not change its nature, but the sinner can change his ways and God gives him every chance and every help to do this, up to his last moment of life. No sinner will be excluded from heaven because of the sins he committed but because he did not repent of these sins while he had the opportunity.



We must learn a double lesson of patience from this parable. First, to be patient with those who make our spiritual progress more difficult for us—they are actually helping us to be better Christians if we bear with patience the injuries they inflict on us. Second, we must try to imitate the patience God shows in his dealings with sinners. While we must not approve of their evil deeds, or their sins, we must still look on them as our brothers and do all in our power to put them back on the right road to heaven. We can do this by good example, and by fervent prayer for their conversion. This is not easy for human nature, but we can be certain that God will give us the necessary grace and strength to subdue our natural weakness and aversion, if we try to act with charity and true brotherly interest toward our erring fellowmen.

By acting thus, we will not only be helping a weak brother on the rugged road to heaven, we will also be making doubly sure of our own arrival there, for God will never be outdone in generosity.

16º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El Evangelio de hoy es de San Mateo 13: 24-43. En la parábola, la mala hierba no acaba con el trigo. Solamente es más difícil para el trigo crecer hasta la madurez. Así sucede con el Cristiano. Nadie puede quitarle su fe, sin embargo se hace más difícil vivir de acuerdo a su credo por la mala influencia o el mal ejemplo de los pecadores. Y si alguno renuncia por una mala influencia y abandona la práctica de su fe, la culpa es suya. Dios no puede obligar a ningún hombre a servirle.

La paciencia del granjero en dejar crecer la maleza hasta el tiempo de la cosecha, es un ejemplo de la misericordia infinita de Dios hacia los pecadores. La mala hierba no puede cambiar su naturaleza, pero el pecador puede cambiar sus caminos y Dios le da toda oportunidad y ayuda para cambiar hasta en el último momento de su vida. Ningún pecador será excluido del cielo por los pecados cometidos, pero si lo perderá si no se arrepiente de sus pecados mientras tenga la oportunidad.

Hay dos lecciones en esta parábola de la paciencia que debemos aprender. Primero, ser pacientes con los que dificultan nuestro desarrollo espiritual—ellos realmente están ayudándonos a ser mejores cristianos si soportamos con paciencia las heridas que nos afligen. Segundo, debemos imitar la paciencia que Dios muestra hacia los pecadores. Aunque nosotros no debemos aprobar sus malas acciones, ni sus pecados, si debemos mirarlos como a nuestros hermanos y hacer todo lo posible para ponerlos de nuevo en el camino correcto hacia el cielo. Lo podemos lograr con el buen ejemplo, y con la oración ferviente por su conversión. No es fácil pues somos seres humanos, pero podemos estar seguros de que Dios nos dará la gracia y la fuerza necesaria para dominar nuestras debilidades y aversiones de nuestra naturaleza, si tratamos de actuar con caridad y verdadero interés fraternal hacia nuestros errados compañeros.

Si es así, estamos ayudando al hermano débil en el camino escabroso al cielo y también estaremos asegurando doblemente nuestra propia llegada al cielo, porque nada ni nadie supera la generosidad de Dios.

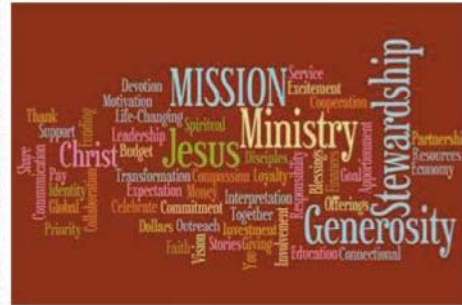
